#### **Countywide Stay-At-Home/Shelter-In-Place Order: IN EFFECT**

By order of Governor Wolf, only businesses that are classified as “life-sustaining” are permitted to operate. Non-life sustaining businesses are to remain closed. ### **City of Chester Government Operations**
