Public comment for 6/23 meeting.

My name is Adriene Webster, 2407 Chestnut St, Chester, PA 19013.

I understand the property at 2405 is slated for demolition this month and wanted to express my appreciation to Mr. Michael Galenta for all the work that goes into removing blighted properties in Chester safely.

I am also inquiring if there is a remediation process for unsanitary health conditions next door such as raccoons, bugs, rats, mice, asbestos, etc.?

As mentioned in previous comments to the Council, I have raccoons that entered my property from next door. I have paid Del County Animal Control, since the winter, some \$1,000.00 + dollars for trapping raccoons that entered my front room ceiling from the adjacent property. Delaware County Animal Control and other companies that came to my home, all said it's from holes next door they are getting in (checked my property and no holes for racoon entry found).

When the adjacent property is removed, please advise how I can coordinate with the demolition team and the City to get my ceiling sanitized before it's sealed permanently. I know there is a latrine left behind from these animals that can lead to serous health issues. Del County Animal Control and others do clean-outs, but I would need to coordinate that with you to ensure safety for everyone. Please advise how this coordination can be done as I want to ensure it's cleaned out of my home avoiding potential health hazzards for me and my family.

Thank you again for helping keep our neighborhood safe and all the work you do for the Chester citizens. Look forward to hearing how I can work with you on this issue.

This is information I researched why it's important to clean up racoon latrine found in home (not need to be read in public comment)

If you have found a raccoon latrine near your home, cleaning the area may prevent possible infection. Newly deposited eggs take at least 2-4 weeks to become infective. Prompt removal and destruction of raccoon feces will reduce risk for exposure and possible infection.

- Feces and material contaminated with raccoon feces should be removed and burned, buried, or sent to a landfill.
- Most chemicals do not kill roundworm eggs; however, heat kills the eggs instantly.
- Treat feces-soiled decks, patios, and other surfaces with boiling water or a propane torch (please contact your local fire department for regulations and safety practices).

The parasite invades the lungs, liver, heart, eyes, and brain and sparks serious inflammation throughout the body. While some people make a full recovery, the infection can leave others blind, in a coma, or with permanent brain damage. It's sometimes fatal. Common in raccoons, who "shed millions of *B. procyonis* eggs daily in their feces," the Pediatrics researchers explain. Those eggs are extremely hardy, sometimes able to cause an infection even years after they've been expelled.
