WHEREAS, on November 23, 2022, Chester City Council accepted the award of the Delco Green Ways Round 2 Connect (Trail) Projects, in the amount of \$500,000, for improvements related to the Crozer Park – Chester Creek Trail; and

WHEREAS, as a stipulation of the award the City agreed to transfer the grant management responsibilities to the Chester Economic Development Authority;

WHEREAS, the project consists of plans to construct a Multi-Use Recreational Trail within Crozer Park, part of the regional Circuit Trail Network; which includes the replacement of the existing asphalt surface to provide an ADA compliant trail; the installation of interpretive signs to demonstrate the City’s unique heritage, the installation of a lookout area to facilitate a connection between residents and nature; other improvements that include installing concrete curbs & sidewalks, stone step rehabilitation, and outdoor picnic areas; ADA compliant parking stalls and park amenities; plans also include enhancing stormwater management by de-paving an existing abandoned pool facility and parking area to construct a rain garden and forested area and proposed additional streambank stabilization along eroded sections of the trail; and

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHESTER DOES RESOLVE:

That it does hereby authorize entering into the Delaware County Green Ways Municipal Grant Program Agreement, by and between the City of Chester, the County of Delaware and Chester Economic Development Authority for the Crozer Park – Chester Creek Trail #DGW-R2-21-06-05, for the purpose of the following:

1. CEDA shall be responsible for all grant management responsibilities of the City which shall include:
 - a. Applying for disbursements of Grant funds hereunder;
 - b. Receiving, holding and applying Grant funds in accordance with this Agreement;
 - c. Contracting for and constructing the Project as described herein; and
 - d. Keeping all records required hereby.

2. This transfer shall not relieve the City of its obligations hereunder to indemnify the County, to record the Declaration of Public Trust, Covenants, Conditions, and Restriction to restrict the use of the Project as set forth herein, to construct and maintain the project, to fund costs of the Project which exceed the Grant, to properly apply the Grant funds and to reimburse County for overpayments.

WHEREAS, the City of Chester is a recipient of grant funds under the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) Program administered by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD); and

WHEREAS, the Chester City Council previously approved a budget and Annual Action Plan for the Fiscal Year 2019 CDBG Program; and

WHEREAS, HUD permits grant recipients to revise and amend previous budgets and Annual Action Plans; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the Federal Regulations governing the CDBG Program certain changes and revisions to the Annual Action Plans may be considered a substantial amendment as outlined in the City's Citizen Participation Plan, "a. To make a change in an approved program that increases or decreases the cost of the approved activity by more than 50% or changes (increases or decreases) in the service area and/or class of beneficiaries of an activity by more than 50%; b. To undertake an activity using funds from any entitlement program (including program income) which was not previously described in an approved Annual Action Plan"; and

WHEREAS, the City was allocated a total of \$1,037,123 in Community Development Block Grant Coronavirus (CDBG-CV) funds to assist the City with its response to the effects of the coronavirus-related public health crisis; and

WHEREAS, the City previously amended its Fiscal Year 2019 Annual Action Plan to add eligible projects to be carried out with CDBG-CV funds; and

WHEREAS, the City desires to amend the Fiscal Year 2019 Annual Action Plan to adjust the budgets of existing CDBG-CV projects set forth in the attached Exhibit A and add the following new projects:

1. Upgrades to Fire Station 82 that will improve ventilation, reduce contact among the firefighters, and improve health-related living conditions at the Station. Budget - \$200,000.00.
2. Purchase of personal protective equipment and supplies to assist the Fire Department in their efforts to keep the community and themselves safe and reduce the spread of contamination and infection, including the Coronavirus, among the firefighters. Budget - \$100,000.00.

WHEREAS, it has been determined that the proposed changes and revisions to the Fiscal Year 2019 CDBG Program require a Substantial Amendment and the City's Citizen Participation Plan has been followed; and

WHEREAS, a draft of the Substantial Amendment to the Fiscal Year 2019 Annual action Plan was on public display from April 24, 2023, through May 23, 2023; the City held a public hearing on the Substantial Amendment on May 10, 2023; and all comments received from agencies, groups, and residents were taken into consideration in the preparation of the final document.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHESTER, DELAWARE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, DOES RESOLVE:

1. That the Substantial Amendment to the Fiscal Year 2019 Annual Action Plan CDBG Program is hereby in all respects approved, and the City Clerk is hereby directed to file a copy of said Substantial Amendment with the Official Minutes of this Meeting of this Council.
2. That the City Council of the City of Chester is cognizant of the conditions that are imposed in the undertaking and carrying out of the Community Development Block Grant Program with federal financial assistance under Title I, including those relating to (1) the relocation of site occupants, (2) the prohibition of discrimination because of race, color, age, religion, sex, disability, familial status, or national origin, and (3) other assurances as set forth under the certifications.
3. That the Mayor of the City of Chester, on behalf of the City Council, is authorized to file the above-referenced Substantial Amendment.
4. That the Mayor, on behalf of the City of Chester, Pennsylvania, is authorized to provide assurances and/or certifications as required by the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974, as amended, and any other supplemental or revised data which HUD may request in review of the above-referenced Substantial Amendment.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF CHESTER, DELAWARE COUNTY, PENNSYLVANIA, ARTICLE 507, ENTITLED “VEHICLE OPERATION”, OF THE CODIFIED ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF CHESTER, PENNSYLVANIA, 1978, AS SUPPLEMENTED AND AMENDED; BY AMENDING SECTION 507.04 ENTITLED “TRUCKS PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS; LICENSING WASTE TRUCKS OVER 18 TONS” SUBSECTION (a) INCREASING THE GROSS VEHICLE WEIGHT TO 16,000 POUNDS AND ADDING NEW SUBSECTION (8) TO ADOPT A NEW TRAFFIC CIRCULATION PROHIBITING VEHICLES OVER 16,000 POUNDS FROM TRAVELING ON CROSBY STREET FROM EAST 13TH STREET TO EAST 14TH STREET, AND REPEALING ALL ORDINANCES OR PARTS OF ORDINANCES INCONSISTENT THEREWITH.

THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF CHESTER DOES ORDAIN:

SECTION 1. That Section 507.04 entitled “TRUCKS PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS; LICENSING WASTE TRUCKS OVER 18 TONS”, of Article 507 entitled “Vehicle Operation” of the Part Five Traffic Code of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Chester, 1978, as supplemented and amended, which reads as follows:

“507.04 TRUCKS PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS;
LICENSING WASTE TRUCKS OVER 18 TONS.

- (a) No person shall operate any motor vehicle with a manufacturer’s gross vehicle weight exceeding 10,000 pounds over or upon the following streets:

Be and the same is hereby enacted to read as follows:

“507.04 TRUCKS PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS;
LICENSING WASTE TRUCKS OVER 18 TONS.

(a) No person shall operate any motor vehicle with a manufacturer's gross vehicle weight exceeding 16,000 pounds over or upon the following streets:

SECTION 2. That Section 507.04 entitled "TRUCKS PROHIBITED; EXCEPTIONS; LICENSING WASTE TRUCKS OVER 18 TONS," of Article 507, entitled "Vehicle Operation" of the Part Five Traffic Code of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Chester, 1978, as supplemented and amended, adding new Subsection 8, which reads as follows:

(8) Crosby Street from East 13th Street to East 14th Street.

SECTION 3. That this Ordinance shall be effective immediately upon passage.

SECTION 4. That all Ordinance or parts of Ordinances inconsistent with the provision of this Ordinance are hereby repealed. If any section, part, or clause of this Ordinance is declared invalid or unconstitutional by a court of competent jurisdiction, the remainder of this Ordinance shall remain in full force and effect.
